As we enter into the fall season I am reminded of our own "seasons" and life phases. I am feeling the symptoms of the classic "sandwich generation" diagnosis. Many of us are... We experience troublesome feelings of worry, exhaustion, guilt and sadness...just to name a few. We can get stretched to the limit, tired (mentally & physically), and carry that weight of caring for both parent and children until we nearly collapse.

November is "National Caregiver Month". Yes, I recognize that it is October, but I want to make you aware of the upcoming opportunities for you and others like you who are caring for family members.

Covenant's Care Team Ministry in conjunction with the Area Agency on Aging of Dane County is offering a fantastic series that addresses many of the issues of the caregiver. It is appropriately titled "**Taking Care of YOU: Powerful Tools for Family Caregiving**". This is a six-week class series that addresses those special needs of caregivers of persons impacted by dementia, serious illness or injury. Each session will focus on effective ways to reduce stress, how to communicate feelings, manage challenging situations and master tough caregiving decisions. We will be meeting at Covenant. This series begins Tuesday, October 4th, 2:30-5:00 pm. We will meet each Tuesday through November 8th. The hope is to form a support group of caregivers to share ideas, lend support and experience the joy of the upcoming holiday season as a "caregiver family". The course is just \$10. All participants receive a copy of *The Caregiver Helpbook*, which addresses many of the necessary questions we encounter while caregiving. 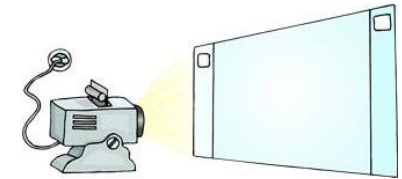

Jim Wallis tells of how on Saturdays the Sojourners Community opens a food line to the hungry and homeless of Washington, DC who live within sight of the White House. Before they open the

doors, they gather around the food, hold hands, and are led in prayer by Mary Glover, the best pray-er of the community - someone who herself stood in that food line a few years earlier. Wallis says "she prays as if she knows the person with whom she's talking," and this is what she prays: "Lord, we know you'll be coming through this line today. So help us to treat you well."

I am looking for twenty-four people who would like to extend a welcome to people visiting our church for the first time. We have a dream of training twelve sets of two to visit and welcome the stranger in our midst. On October 9th at 11:45 am we are having a lunch to prepare *Hospitality Greeters* at Covenant. The goal is to prepare two people for every twelve weeks to visit our guests with baked treats, a hospitality bag of information and a thank you for joining us at worship. It is also our intent to coach members of our congregation to staff the hospitality center in front of our sound room. In many ways this is an opportunity to welcome others in the name of our Lord.

The training will be conducted by our Faith in Action Hospitality Team - Julie Rice, Patty Anderson, Kelly Schieldt, Kathy Olson, Judy Roy and Denise Pigarelli. just visiting with pastor george...LOSS AND LIFE

The lightning and thunder happened as one that July morning. They lifted me off my dining room chair at the breakfast table. Solveig rushed to the laundry room where she could see the front yard. She exclaimed, "It took our tree!"

I went to the front porch...sure enough, the 35 foot tall linden lay across the sidewalk, extending 10 feet onto Kings Lynn Road. Not lightning but wind—a straight-line gust of wind—took the tree down, one inch below the ground. The wonderful, cooling shade on our east rooms was gone. The air conditioner labors earlier and harder than before.

We experienced a loss. We felt sad that this 20-plus-year-old tree, this new friend of ours for only eight months, had toppled. Passers-by expressed their sadness, too, commenting that they would miss the beautiful tree.

Three weekends ago I planted a new tree. I followed directions carefully, digging a large hole, keeping the tree at the right depth, watering it well, covering the soil with mulch. I wonder when it will shade our east rooms?

I've experienced other losses in my life. The barn burned. Cars have worn out, and so have clothes. I've moved to new communities, leaving friends behind. Mom and dad moved off the farm where I grew up. Death has taken friends and relatives—October 9 marks the anniversary of my mom's death in 2004. Some losses I saw coming, others surprised me like lightning and thunder happening at the same time.

Can I ever replace a tree? Can I ever replace a loss? I think not. No thing, no person will ever be just like what I lost. What I have loved and appreciated gave me its unique shade, her special giftedness, his personal quirks and qualities. I remember, at times with tears, how each touched my life and how my life has changed because of the loss.

But I'll plant other trees, grow into new communities, and form other friendships. They, too, will enrich my life, often in ways I can't even anticipate. Yes, even in the face of loss, the pulse of life keeps beating. God keeps providing. Jesus keeps showing up in every person, giving me opportunities to welcome him. The Spirit

keeps opening my eyes to God's presence in loss and in life, opening my arms to embrace others with Christ-like love, and opening my heart in gratitude for gifts all around me, including you!

SERVICE/MISSION TRIP TO NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE



Who? Members and friends of Covenant, at least 16 years old

What? Repair flooded homes—variety of work from electrical to roofing to drywall to painting to cooking to ??? Experience is helpful but not required...training will be provided

When? Saturday, November 5—Saturday, November 12...work week will be Monday, November 7, through Friday, November 11

Where? Nashville, Tennessee

Why? Jesus calls us to help those in need. May 1 to May 2, 2010, more than 13 inches of rain fell causing record breaking flash flooding in Tennessee. Though some of the hardest-hit areas were in or around Nashville, the flooding was widespread across the state. A total of 46 Tennessee counties have qualified for federal disaster relief. Regular homeowners' and renters' insurance does not cover flood damage, and the vast majority of flooded homeowners did not have flood insurance because their houses were located outside of a flood plain. Much of the cleanup, debris removal and gutting has been completed although some of this work still remains. Home repairs are in progress.

With whom? Lutheran Services in Tennessee (www.lstn.org) coordinates Lutheran Disaster Response in Tennessee. They provide lodging, breakfast and lunch. They line up the places to work and assign us to work teams with people who have experience in the tasks to be done.

Youth Participation Sundays

October 9th and November 13th!

Our 1st-6th grade students will be singing at the opening of the 10:30 worship service on Sunday, October 9th. Please come and hear these very talented musicians as they lift their voices to God. On November 13th, again at the 10:30 service, the voices of our 3-year-old, 4-year-old and kindergarten students will fill the sanctuary with music. Thanks be to God!

Family Worship Service

Our second Family Worship Service will be on Sunday, October 16th at 9:10 am. The first service was a huge success, and we are certain that you will enjoy the second one even more. As a reminder, Family Worship Services occur during the Sunday school hour, in place of Sunday school (there are no classes on those Sundays). Parents are encouraged to come and worship with their children. The service is a bit shorter than our other services (45-50 minutes in length) and the intent is that we find ways to hold the kids' attention, which makes the worship experience more pleasant for all. These services will always include Holy Communion. Confirmation sermon notes can be taken during these services, and confirmation students get credit for Sunday school attendance provided that they complete a sermon note. Join us! See what it's all about!



Speaking of **Confirmation** – We are off and flying, with our largest class of confirmation students in decades. We have 70 students participating, with 18 guides leading them through small group time, and a core team of another five adults. Our seventh grade class alone is made up of 27 students! We also have 9 high school students participating in **Peer Ministry** during confirmation time, which means at 8:15 on Wednesday evenings, over 100 people gather for worship together! You are always welcome to come and join us for worship – it's just 15 minutes of reflection, music and prayer, but it is renewing!

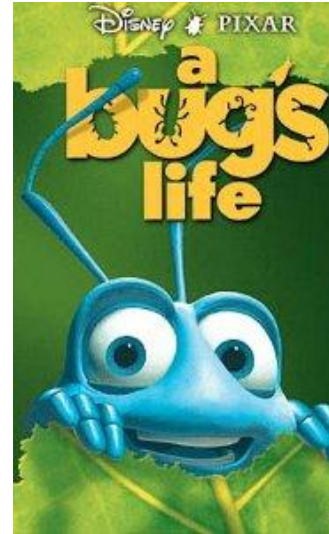
