July HOSPITALITY

Covenant Lutheran Church has a wonderful, rich history of extending hospitality both to members as well as to people who are not members of the congregation. In 2009, the Hospitality "Framework" fully replaced two former committees, the Evangelism Committee and the Fellowship Committee. Because hospitality embodies the purposes of both evangelism and fellowship, Covenant has adopted a "hospitality philosophy":

Whatever we plan or do—within or outside of Covenant-- we should think about how what we are doing reflects what life is like when Christ is a part of who we are.

Christ extended his love and hospitality to others to spread the Good News; we are called to do the same. The Bible includes many verses and stories about hospitality, both to people who are known and not previously known to us. Some well-known verses: Hebrews 13:2, Luke 10:38-42, Matthew 25: 34-46. Additionally, the ELCA branding, "God's Work, Our Hands" fits well with hospitality.

At Covenant, Hospitality is led by a facilitator (or co-facilitators) who assist(s) leaders of Covenant ministries (in collaboration with church council representatives) as required in order to promote the "hospitality philosophy." The structure of Covenant's hospitality is similar to a wagon wheel with interaction between the hospitality facilitator(s) and the church council representatives in the center of the wheel; Covenant ministries are the spokes of the wheel.

At July 2011 worship services, you'll find a Time and Talent form for just the area of Hospitality. Please consider completing this form and leave in the offering plate or turn into the church office. You will be contacted within two weeks of our receipt of the form to confirm your offer of hospitality participation.

Please prayerfully consider serving in Covenant's hospitality ministry – there are a variety of opportunities with different time commitments. Choose one, choose many!

Reflexiones

I am really excited to celebrate the love of Briana and Chris during Memorial Day weekend. While I was preparing a toast, I kept overhearing the news about all the apocalyptic messages that the world was coming to an end. And I thought, *no, we have a celebration to host this next week!* Many of you probably caught some of the hullabaloo about the world coming to an end at 6 pm CST on May 21; which means the prediction would happen right after the sermon on Saturday night! It could be one memorable sermon. Actually at 6 pm we were singing the hymn Mark selected titled, *“Blessing, Honor and Glory to the Lamb”* under the section in our hymnody titled - End Times. After singing the hymn I leaned over to Mark and said, “I guess we are still here.” The celebrations of love and Easter still go on!

I love the theology of Marge Gullickson who said,

“I heard about the prediction and you know what I did today? I planted tomatoes.”

She responded the same way Martin Luther did back in his day when there was much hubbub of the world coming to an end. He said,

“Even if I knew that tomorrow the world would go to pieces, I would still plant my apple tree.”

Both of these great theologians were thinking about doing something for another to enhance their lives. How’s that for faith in action?

Jesus said, *“But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven nor the Son, but only the Father. Keep alert!” - Mark 13:32*

The word *apocalypse* simply means to reveal and to uncover. And if facing reality brings us despair, we need to ask why. Above all, we must reject the literalist notion that apocalyptic literature is about a future pie in the sky. It is a command to come to full attention in the here and now. And that is hard to do.

Marge and Martin had it right. If your life is going to end today, do something beautiful for another. It’s time to celebrate God’s presence with us now! Peggy and I have the love of Briana and Chris to celebrate this week! Do you know what I’m doing today? Planting flowers in planters as people come to celebrate.

Enjoy each day as “the apple of God’s eye!”

just visiting with pastor george...NEW LIFE

God immerses us in new life these spring days. Blooming spring flowers, budding/leafing trees, abundant dandelions, and baby birds and animals lift my spirits. In early May I frightened a small bunny out of its protective bush as I mowed our lawn. In mid-April a mother robin began building a nest just ten feet outside our dining room window at eye level to us. By late April she had laid four eggs. Then on May 10th, robinettes (what are baby robins called?) hatched! These annual cycles of new life point to the loving care of God, reminding me of the words of Jesus: ^{26a}*Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them...* ^{28b}*Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin,* ²⁹*yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these.* (Matthew 6) I thank God that Jesus assures us that God provides for all of created life, including us!

On Easter God did an even more wondrous deed. God broke the known cycle of birth, life and death with the RESURRECTION of Jesus. God surprises us with NEW LIFE beyond the grave, NEW LIFE not constrained by the limits of time and space, NEW LIFE here and now, NEW LIFE lived as Jesus lived, in service to others to help meet their needs!

Even as we live this NEW LIFE, we know the pain of death. Within two weeks of Easter, Eunice Veum and Phil Kennedy died; their families and friends shed tears and continue to miss them, thanking God for the gift of memory of those they love. But they do not grieve without hope. They have heard the promise of Jesus, *“Do not let your hearts be troubled...In my Father’s home are many dwelling places. If it were not so would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also.”* (John 14:1a, 2-3)

Remember the robinettes? On May 15, I looked out our window to check on them. The nest laid on our patio, apparently torn from the container in which it had been built. No sight of robinettes or parents. Do the robin parents grieve? Solveig and I felt anger and sadness that something had destroyed those little ones.

I think of human parents, parents of children who die of hunger, of malaria, of cancer, of violence, of war. I feel anger and sadness. Those parents, like us, need to hear a new word in the midst of tears, “God gives NEW LIFE, even beyond death.” And they need us, and we need each other, to be present, to listen, to care, to share hope, to be signs of NEW LIFE.



Social Justice

New country? New home? Learn how to help...

Covenant has been a strong partner with Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan in helping welcome refugees to Wisconsin. Last October six members of the Khati family resettled in Madison with strong support from Covenant; they had lived as refugees in Nepal for 17 years after fleeing from Bhutan. LSS has committed to resettle 100 refugees from either Bhutan or Iraq in both 2011 and 2012. They need congregations as partners. Covenant’s *Faith in Action* emphasis set a goal of helping one family each of those years.

If you want to learn more, if you have sensed God’s Spirit calling you to welcome the stranger, if you are curious, then you are invited to an informational meeting at 6:30 pm, Wed., June 8. Together we can be a blessing!

“I was hungry and you gave me food...” Stoughton Food Pantry received over **335 pounds of goods** from Covenant. ELCA WORLD HUNGER received **\$1,258.87** from piggybank collections.



God’s Global Barnyard, a ministry of ELCA WORLD HUNGER, received **\$1,451.00**, which will purchase **one cow, 30 pigs, and 351 chicks** to provide both food and income for people. THANK YOU to all who gave generously during Lent to help feed the hungry.

Fair Trade Fair offered items for purchase the two weekends before Easter. People in poverty around the world make these unique items, so the sales total of \$1,651.90 greatly benefits them. Social Justice Ministry Team receives 10% of the sales to support our ministries here. THANK YOU to all who made purchases. (All items came to us from SERV Store, 2701 Monroe St, Madison, where you can always purchase items which provide support to artisans and farmers worldwide.)

Mark Doll, Minister of Faith Development

In some ways I am grateful that May is over. May is a tough month for me, and probably for most people in Stoughton, but particularly so when you work in a church. Obviously May brings Syttende Mai and Mother's Day, but it also brings (typically) Confirmation Sunday and now Peer Ministry Commissioning. And, it brings recitals, concerts, award ceremonies, beginnings of soccer seasons (okay these often start in April, but frankly, that's just insane), and so much more.

I get overwhelmed. Do you? Do you ever feel as though there is so much going on in your life that you can't fully process it? Any and all of the activities I listed above may be part of your schedule, but I didn't even talk about the unexpected: the illness or even death of a loved one, your own illness, job insecurities, relationship problems, worries about finances and unexpected bills, and on and on. How do we cope? Do we simply cope because we have no other option?

I'm sure the answer to that is "sometimes, yes." I'm urging you to change the answer to the question "how do you cope?" to "with the help of God." Interestingly enough (well, probably not really, since we are a church), that's the response we look for when we ask young people to affirm their baptisms (confirmation): "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me."

Why then, wouldn't we ask God to help us and guide us through all the other things in our life? Why would we try to walk alone? Why would we allow ourselves to get so overwhelmed in our lives that we aren't even able to let God walk with us? And here's the reality: June is here, and there is still much that I find overwhelming: High school graduation (something I am completely not ready for; my personal opinion is that no one should graduate until they are 25 or so, earlier only upon parents' request), confirmation camp, soccer camps, mission trip planning, VBS planning, and, believe it or not, Sunday school planning for next year. So ... if I get through May alone, should my plan be to get through June, and July, and August, and ... all alone?

My point is, if you haven't gotten it already, is that you do not need to walk alone. Nor, even, can we. God is always walking with us, whether we want His support or not. But why wouldn't we? You can call on and count on God. Call on Him in prayer. Call on Him in

worship. Call on Him by calling the church office and saying you need some help.

I conclude this with as strong of a statement as I can write: Don't let the answer to the question "How do you cope" be "I've decided not to." If you can't cope, if you're feeling overwhelmed, if you're feeling alone, know this: You can cope, but maybe you need some help, you may be overwhelmed, but God and many people love you dearly, and you may feel alone, but many are standing by to make that feeling go away. Know that you are always God's child, no matter what. You are always loved, no matter what. You are important to Him, and to those who love you – which includes this congregation – no matter what.

Adult Education Opportunity - Preaching and Teaching Romans - "Coffee and Study"

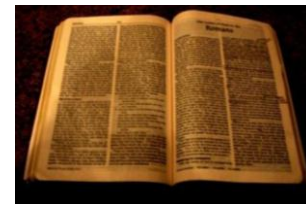

My goal is not only to teach but preach out of Romans in the summer months (When I have the privilege to preach). Paul's words were written to believers in the capital city of the Roman Empire and it is a book that has inspired many over the centuries. The message of Romans was a turning point for Martin Luther and his work as a teacher, writer and reformer. In his *Preface to Romans* Luther writes, "this epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and is truly the purest gospel...It is a bright light, almost sufficient to illuminate the entire Holy Scriptures. (*Martin Luther's Basic Theological Writings*, a second ed., Fortress, 2005, pp.98-99)

This acronym reminds us of the importance of attention. Just as you pay attention in a SOLER style to those you love; it is our intention to pay attention to each of the families under our care at Covenant. One of our congregational goals through **Faith in Action** is to connect with every family over the next three years. So we are squarely facing this challenge, opening ourselves up and leaning into the task of making a connection. We have several families who have not responded to multiple contacts in a variety of forms over the past 6 months. In June we are sending out a letter to each of these families.

If you happen to receive the letter please return the contact information enclosed to indicate your intent. This is our attempt to update our membership after a number of years. Inside the letter it says,

“If we do not hear from you with this contact information (or you fail to return the enclosed information card), we assume you choose to be placed on our inactive list for the remainder of this year. At anytime during this last six months of 2011 you may show you wish to remain on our active membership roster by worshipping with us or giving a contribution towards our ministry together. We very much want you to grow in your faith with us as part of Covenant. All we ask is that when you worship sign the pew pads to let us know of your presence.”

In January of 2012 we will remove each of the names who have not responded or who have indicated that they have made transitions to another community.

Our hope is that we will continue to attend to our congregation every 6 months. By doing so, we will have an awareness of those placed in our shepherding care.

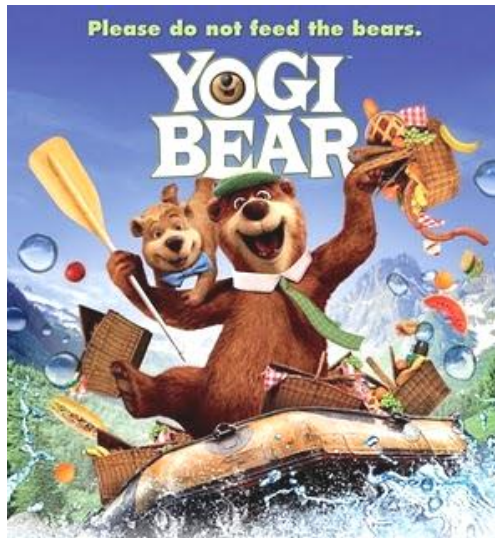
